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

I had to return this great jacket for two reasons...I ordered a large because I tried the Storm King in Medium and it was too small. This was was a bit too large in Large I'm 6'1" 170 and this fit a bit baggy. I don't like baggy. The color was great though. Also, STP listed a bunch of different Arc Jackets right after I bought this one and the Arc's were simply better options for my needs...I ended up going with an Arc.

Like my Marmot Trident review, This jacket has everything you might be looking for a resort ski jacket: Goretex, pockets in perfect places, length to backside, and powderskirt.
